

Given the high priority and social value of professional positions, children and youth in residential care are once again exposed to the risk of social exclusion. SAPERE AUDE - "Dare to think for yourself!" The SAPERE AUDE- project aims to implement a mentoring pilot initiative with a duration of nine months. Based on the mentoring partnership between the mentor and the child/youngster (mentee), the central objective is to empower the mentee and support its individual educational goals. This aim can be achieved through diverse recreational activities during the social mentoring process. Therefore, the activities should always encourage and refer to the personal resources of the mentee. To expand the mentees perspective and offer new ideas on

employment or life in general, mentors from heterogeneous social and working fields are highly welcome.

Several European countries, like for example France and Croatia, are already successfully practicing social mentoring. With the start of the mentoring pilot activity and the implementation of SAPERE AUDE in an international context, the project also aims to provide a theoretical framework for the benefit of international standards, in order to give also potential new partners the opportunity to implement social mentoring in their organizations. Besides, the mentoring initiative will include an extensive evaluation and handbook based on scientific standards.

showed, that only eight percent of those in residential care have access to the higher education, five times less than European children and youth in general. Many of children and young people affected are suffering from broad systematic disadvantages regarding their individual educational development. This disgrace is often caused by abrupt and dramatic life changes, which often also lead to extensive limitations in their personal scholastic education. Compensation of these obstacles to development involves many difficulties. The children and youth concerned often tend not to reach satisfying employment opportunities or other individual educational solutions.

The procedure will also be finalized by an international conference in order to provide a fruitful exchange of experiences. 
